STEWARDSHIP RETREAT

"Giving wholeheartedly" is the theme for our life together in the Wisconsin Annual Conference in 2010. To support churches in developing a spirit of generosity, the Board of Camp and Retreat Ministries and the Wisconsin United Methodist Foundation are joining together to sponsor the third annual Stewardship Retreat at Pine Lake Camp. The primary focus of this year's retreat will be developing a 3-5 year stewardship plan. Clergy are encouraged, but not required, to bring one or more lay leaders from the congregation with them. Resources from the Foundation, including a summary of stewardship resources from the Foundation library, will be shared. Time will be allowed for group presentations as well as developing individual church proposals. Questions to be addressed include: "What are the advantages of a year-round stewardship program versus an autumn campaign? How can we present the basics of percentage giving and tithing? How can we help our members address the credit crisis? What types of financial stewardship programs are available? When is it best to use a particular program? The principles of financial stewardship will be discussed in a casual, retreat setting with approximately one third of the time devoted to developing individual church proposals. This day and one half long retreat starts Wednesday with lunch and ends after an early dinner on Thursday. Cost is \$35 for double occupancy, \$60 for single occupancy.
